Message from Dianne & Kelly Kimmett (Lindsay's Parents)

Lindsay Kimmett was a member of the U of C Medical Class of 2009. Sadly she was killed in a motor vehicle accident in 2008 before she was able to realize her dream of being an Emergency Physician. She was an active member of Friday afternoon hockey and the captain of the Macaques girls hockey team. In fact, she had taken a group of non-hockey players and taught them the game. Their first win came at the Atrophy Cup in 2008.

She shared her competitive hockey drive with Joe MacLellan (a member of her class) and met Jason Baserman (a member of the class of 2014) on those Friday afternoon skates. They discussed how much fun it would be to host a pond hockey tournament. Joe and Jason have carried through on that discussion and this past weekend hosted the 4th Annual Kimmett Cup. This year 32 teams participated in the outdoor pond hockey tournament in Cochrane. The pond area becomes a village for the day of the tournament. Players come and go, friends and family gather to watch, spectators warm themselves around fire pits, the entire area is alive with music, hotdogs are devoured, a local church group sells their homemade goodies, crowds gather to chat and bid on the silent auction items and finally a wrap up party is held to award trophies to the winners. At the end of the day all proceeds benefit the Lindsay Leigh Kimmett Memorial Foundation. This year over \$24,000.00 will be directed to the Lindsay Virtual Human project – a collaborative project at the University of Calgary between the Evolutionary & Swarm Design Laboratory of the Department of Computer Science in the Faculty of Science and Undergraduate Medical Education in conjunction with the Virtual Medical Education Unit in the Faculty of Medicine. The LINDSAY project provides a collection of biological models and computational tools for research and learning in the context of human anatomy and physiology.
